Sorting out the difference between **wealth** and **value** ... is addressed by today's scriptures.

Ecclesiastes is a type of writing called "**wisdom literature**." (2)

But he tempers his **negative, despairing** (2) view in the last paragraph.

Within what is **sacred** is where we find wealth of **worth**.

He has made gracious **abundance** into a personal **problem**.

Notice that in the parable, he **speaks** only with **himself**.

One passage that may ring familiar begins chapter **11**.

The Teacher admits the value of **community**.

He wants us to discover the wealth of the **Kingdom** along his **servant** path.

Compassion is worth more than a Porsche.

We're called to step out of the **wind's flow** and to see above and beyond the **debris** it swirls.
